

Tickets are available at www.ticketswest.com. Cost is \$45/advance and \$55/Day-Of for Friday, \$45/advance and \$55/Day-Of for Saturday, and \$40/advance and \$55/Day-Of for Sunday. NO tickets are available on the Fair Site. Tickets for children (12 and under) are free, seniors (65 and over) and Alter-Abled are \$5 off.

Shuttle Bus Service [K2]

Ride the bus! You don't need a bus ticket; your Fair pass gets you on any LTD bus for free. That includes fast and frequent shuttle service from Valley River Center and the downtown LTD station. The OCF Child Care Crew is dedicated to bringing the magic of Fair to the youngest among us! We offer a variety of enriching and interactive family-friendly services and activities for kids of all ages. On Sesame Street, at the top of the Eight (past Main Stage near the Ritz Sauna), we provide checked-in, supervised child care with a wide range of programs and activities to delight and entertain. Come visit us on Wally's Way between the Caravan Stage and the Front Porch, where families will find a kid's wonderland, including family-friendly entertainment, our enchanted castle playground, a free library (bring a book, take a book!), and many more hands-on crafting, learning and imaginative play areas.

Child Care Crew is also pleased to provide several fully staffed "Mellow Spaces" throughout Fair: shady, comfortable rest areas where families with small children can get off the path, relax and recharge. You can find Mellow Spaces on Sesame Street (at the top of the Eight across from Ritz Sauna) and on Wally's Way (between our Info Booth and the Caravan Stage). Finally, we're pleased to announce a new presence on the south end of Fair on the Moon Path at the north entrance to Xavanadu. Come see what we're up to!

Chela Mela Meadow: Stretch your wings along the banks of the Long Tom River [K7]

Chela Mela invites you to create, play, chill and dance. We have assembled musicians from across the world and across town to entertain you at the Monkey Palace. Enjoy some lounge time in the Cuckoo's Nest. Learn to juggle at the Yes You Canopy; we supply the toys. For young ones with a creative streak—stop by Five Fingers of Fun for an original craft project. Grab a bite from our amazing food booths, and stroll through Wooten Way for crafts and bodywork.

Want to parade? Check out Dragon's Lair. Join in before 1:45. You can get painted and parade through with Peachi the Dragon and her drummers.

Looking for something quieter? The Dharma Garden offers a peaceful retreat under a giant tree by the side of the river. Join in the yoga classes at 12:00, 2:00 and 4:00.

The Mighty Tiny Puppet Theater presents traditional and original stories with a range of styles. Kids and adults gather under the red, yellow and black tent to experience puppetry on the Fair's tiniest stage.

Twice a day, at the Morningwood Odditorium, Fremont Players present Little Red Ridinghood and The Three Little Pigs. Will Red Ridinghood deliver her basket of goodies to Grandma's house in time for Happy Hour? Will the three pigs, Binkie, Pinkie and Clem get scared off their land? Will Prince Rupert the Snood ever grow up and think about anyone but himself? Get yourself to the Odditorium to find out—12:00 or 3:30 daily. British-Panto encourages audience participation: come and boo The Villain—Mayor Smallberries. Cheer for our heroine, Red Ridinghood. Tap your feet to the mellifluous stylings of the Fremont Philharmonic Orchestra. The Players present their original version of this traditional story, bursting with songs, jokes, physical comedy and wit for all ages.

The Still Living Room [H5]

Looking for a quiet place to relax or learn some Fair history? Stop by the Still Living Room, located on Strawberry Lane, between Jill's Crossing and The Junction. Elder volunteers create this special place for Fair goers to relax and enjoy the magic and ambiance that make the Fair special. There's plenty of seating and shade for quiet repose or conversation, a place to honor those who have passed from this worldly plane, and gorgeous displays that convey Fair history. Stop by and savor the moment!

Keeping it Green

To demonstrate our commitment to making an event built on sustainability and care for our planet, the Fair has identified reducing our carbon footprint as an important area where we can have an impact. Fair staff and volunteers are engaging in understanding our current carbon impacts to identify areas where we can make significant improvements. Xavanadu hosts a demonstration of composting toilets so we can see if this is a technology that will help meet the Fair's needs and goals. Reducing individual automobile trips to the Fair is one of the most obvious and clear ways to reducing carbon emissions. Thank you to everyone who bicycled, carpooled or took the bus to the Fair!

Medical & Crisis Response [D5 & L3]

As it has since dinosaurs roamed the Earth and birds learned to fly, the White Bird Rock Medicine crew is returning to OCF to provide its unique brand of medical and crisis intervention services! We want to remind you that White Bird is the emergency response at the Fair and dispatches trained medical and mental health professionals to incidents anywhere on site as needed. We embrace a Harm Reduction approach to compassionate care and all services are free and confidential. Each of our two stations has doctors available 24/7 throughout the event.

Don't call 911 (seriously – please don't), call White Bird! We can be contacted by any staff person carrying a radio or via OCF's internal telephone system (Tinker Bell) located at most major Fair installations like stages, gates and Info Booths. We will come to you!

White Bird's traditional home, Big Bird at booth #243 next to the Main Stage Meadow, will be open 24/7 from 8:00 a.m. Wednesday through 8:00 a.m. Monday.

Our full-service second medical station, Little Wing in Xavanadu near Wind Gate, will be open 24/7 from 8:00 a.m. Thursday through 2:00 p.m. Monday.

Basic First Aid supplies are also available at all Info Booths. A.E.D.'s are distributed throughout the event site (see the Map).

Now take a deep relaxing breath, unclench your jaw, and come frolic in the whimsy, knowing we are there to catch you if you fall!

Our Safety Plan

The Oregon Country Fair will continue to take preventive measures against the spread of COVID-19 and will follow the recommendations of Lane County Public Health and the Oregon Health Authority. While the OCF encourages everyone who is able to be vaccinated against COVID-19 to do so, proof of COVID-19 vaccination is not required at this time for entry to Fair-owned property or sponsored / sanctioned events.

Alter Abled Access & Advocacy [K4 & E5]

Access Advocates for the Alter Abled (4A) promotes equal access for all participants at Fair. 4A provides some equipment loans, sign language interpreters and other assistance as well as advocacy, education and advice. 4A is located in the Dragon's Head at the entrance and in Community Village. An interpreter will be available for up to one hour from 11-4 each day.

Recycling

The Recycling Crew, working with the Fair food artisans, is doing everything we can to eliminate plastic from the Fair. All of the food service ware throughout the Fair, including beverage cups, is compostable! Please dispose of all compostable service ware in the green compost receptacles, not the red landfill receptacles. All utensils you receive will go in the utensil buckets located at each kiosk in the Fair. You will find collection kiosks throughout the site, often run by costumed Recyclers who will happily answer your questions. If you're not sure what goes where, ask a Recycler!

Black Indigenous Person of Golor (BIPOG) Oasis M51

This is a safe space for Black and Brown people to gather and create community in an otherwise white environment. The Oregon Country Fair (OCF) can be an overwhelming place for the uninitiated. It's bombastic, densely populated and there is a lot to do and see. Come fellowship, explore with people who share cultural similarities! We at the BIPOC Oasis offer shelter from the proverbial storm.

We support rest above all else. Resting of the body, mind and soul to reduce stress and increase enjoyment. Shed the mask, take up space, be seen, be heard, be unapologetically Black and Brown and experience joy as resistance. Regroup, reclaim your authentic self in our non-judgmental support space. Find positive nourishment and motivation with members of the OCF BIPOC community.

We acknowledge that the spaces and resources that we seek are not just a matter of convenience or preference but a response to the systematic injustices that have been inflicted upon our community. We acknowledge that the power and strength of life is standing together and choosing to enjoy any aspect of that life is a radical Act. We reject the idea that violence, injustice, discrimination, prejudice, and dominance over others are normal and acceptable acts. This space is dedicated to the needs and experiences of Black and Brown individuals.

While you wait for that to happen, look around Energy Park. You can find people here who are experts in the fields of renewable energy, organic farming and resource-mindful living. Many non-profits, businesses and advocacy groups set up educational exhibits and demonstrations that show some of the alternative energy solutions possible today. Returning this year are some old favorite booths such as Bring Recycling and Peace Seedlings. And the solar cooking parabolas are coming back too. Explore Energy Park's kid-friendly demonstrations about solar power, wind energy, hydro power technologies and more. Discover our greenest zone, Ag Alley, to see showcases of heirloom vegetables and flowers, along with a look at the future of small farms. All in all, Energy Park is a place to find all kinds of solutions.

Imagerium Portrait Studio: Un-Selfies [13]



Come to Spoken Word's four stages: Spirit Tower [I5], Front Porch [I2], Rabbit Hole [I3] and Chez Ray's [K6]. Our speakers this year have been preparing for months, even years, to inspire your soul. Topics range from psychedelics and poetry, to harm reduction, sex worker solidarity, and bringing ritual into our everyday lives. We've even got a rainbow-eating dragon!

This year, our authors include Cheyenne poet Renée Roman Nose and Feminine Linguist Kym Trippsmith. No Simple Road and the Courage Checklist Podcast will be taping live shows and interviews on our stages.

It's also our pleasure to host our first-ever Drag Story Hours in the Rabbit Hole, featuring performers from our first-ever Drag Show in 2022. The Drag Show itself was so dang popular it has graduated to Dance Pavilion for 2023, you won't wanna miss it.

Spoken Word is about connection! We're hosting morning song circles, a new kids' open mic on Chez Ray's, a youth wisdom panel, and a meetup for Fair writers! There's no joy like getting our community on stage.

Plus, all our shady Rabbit Hole programming is family-friendly, so come for Tom Noddy's bubbles and stay for Tzula Propp Harping on the Quantum World or the antics of Dr. Atomic. And don't forget to stop by our new bookstore location next to Rabbit Hole to bring the magic of the written word home!

These will be on display all weekend at the Elders' Still Living Room.





2023 Poster Artist

Emily Poole (www.epooleart.com, @epooleart) is a natural history illustrator, raised in the Rockies and now rooted in the mossy hills of Eugene. She received her BFA in Illustration from the Rhode Island School of Design in 2016 and has created work for numerous organizations including the National Museum of Wildlife Art, Mt. Pisgah Arboretum, Sasquatch Books and High Country News. Emily creates images with the goal of inspiring and educating about the natural world and what we can do to be better stewards of the land. Her concept for the 2023 poster is a followup on the theme of the previous year: now that the Fair has come out of hibernation, a parade of flying animals swoop in to bring food, music and craft to the Fair site. The space that many Fairgoers may know as a parking lot is a lush field of camas every spring, represented in the poster to continue the themes of return and restoration. The biodiversity of the animals and the gifts they bring speak to the abundance of perspectives, skills and energy that Fair guests, staff and volunteers bring to the event each year.

Emily can be located at the OCF Poster Artist Booth just inside the main Dragon Admissions entrance to the Fair, as one enters into the Left Bank.

Philanthropic Phairies

The Fair has been rooted in philanthropy since it began as a fundraiser for a children's school program. Our philanthropy is focused on building community and helping people thrive.

We have three grantmaking programs that together have donated more than \$1.5 million: The Bill Wooten Endowment Fund, the Jill Heiman Vision Fund and Board of Directors donations. To learn more, wander over to Wally's Way to visit the Galleria Philanthropia booth or visit oregoncountryfair.org.

Jill Heiman Vision Fund

Four nonprofit groups with proposals related to the environment and sustainability will receive grants from the donations made to the Jill Heiman Vision Fund at this year's Fair.

- Centro LatinoAmericano will offer programs and workshops such as seed-saving and basket-making through its Líderes (Leaders) program in the Organic Community Garden. The program helps participants develop leadership skills and build a support network as families learn to grow, harvest, and process organic food.
- Community Supported Shelters will install greywater filtration systems to provide an environmental approach to wastewater in their Safe Spot Communities. CSS is working with the University of Oregon's Landscape Architecture and Environmental Studies to build the four-planter filtration systems.



- Looking Glass will purchase tools and gear for the Lane-Metro Youth Corps for projects that will restore natural resources around Lane County.
- Northwest Center for Alternatives to Pesticides (NCAP) will boost awareness of communities impacted by pesticide use through a media campaign and radio show outreach.

Bill Wooten Endowment Fund

The Bill Wooten Endowment Fund awarded a total of \$15,000 to support nonprofit organizations serving youth in the Fair's neighboring communities in the Fern Ridge area. The grants tangibly represent the Fair's deep appreciation of our home community.

Annual Endowment Funding:

- Culture Jam: Fern Ridge area youth received scholarships to attend this eight-day arts-based empowerment camp for teenagers held each summer at the Fair site.
- Fern Ridge Middle School: The school purchased additional band instruments, enabling more students to participate in their popular band program.
- Lane Arts Council: Fern Ridge area children participated in a local "All About Art" immersive summer camp, which blends an exploration of ecology with diverse experiences in the arts.
- Rural Art Center: The Crow-Applegate-Lorane School District depends on the Center to provide after-school multi-cultural art instruction on shortened school days.
- Veneta Elementary School: An artist-in-residence taught all students about the science and method behind tie-dying. Students then created wearable works of art, which they displayed at a "Strolling Art Gallery" during parent-teacher conferences.



• Wordcrafters: This collaborative project with Elmira High School provided an arts residency focusing on spoken word writing and performance.

Leslie Scott Imagine Grant Award

The annual Leslie Scott Imagine Grant Award is recognition given to the endowment-funded project that best represents former Fair General Manager Leslie Scott's contributions to the Fair, which included: providing opportunities for youth, reaching out to our neighbors, and nurturing creativity of all sorts. This year's awardee was Wordcrafters.



Archaeology Park: Super Old School-ing 183

Join us at Ark Park and step back in time along the banks of the Long Tom River. Regional archaeological studies during the 1980s found more than 10,500 years of cultural history on the grounds of the Oregon Country Fair. At Ark Park's museum display you can talk to our archaeologist and learn more about the Fair's educational, research, and preservation efforts. Learn about the Kalapuya people, their history

and the world they lived in then and today. The archaeological sites we care for are part of a larger system of sites along the river. Find out how the Kalapuyans managed their landscape and harvested its bounty. Check out the Ark Park buildings of hand-split cedar, built with traditional construction methods. Visit with true artisans as they show you flint knapping, fire making, hide tanning and basketry.

At the trade-booth, you can learn about ancient skill gatherings or purchase replicated artifacts and instructional books produced by our demonstrators. This year we have several special events, including daily live cedar planking demonstrations and some archaeological celebrities.
