

Tickets are available at aftontickets.com/ocf2024. NO tickets are available on the Fair site.

Early Bird pricing, through June 15th: \$50 for Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Full price after June 15th: \$60 for Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Children 12 and under admitted for free.

Seniors (65 and over) and alter-abled receive \$5 off.

## Shuttle Bus Service [K2]

Ride the bus! You don't need a bus ticket; your Fair pass gets you on any LTD bus for free. That includes fast and frequent shuttle service from Valley River Center and the downtown LTD station. ## Magical-History-Tour-Theaterin Still Living Room

Come visit the Elders' Still Living Room to relax and learn how the MAGIC began and continues.

In the new Magical History Tour Theater, special presenters from the Fair and the Counterculture History Coalition, an international group focused on saving the history of the '60s and '70s, will lead discussions about a variety of counterculture subjects.

Drawing on counterculture archives and their own expertise, speakers will explore topics inherent in the Fair and counterculture movement such as experimenting with lifestyles, political dissent, economic self-reliance and archiving our own histories.

Also new this year is the latest Timeline, highlighting the Fair's history from 2010 until our 50th anniversary, and an 8-minute video exploring the birth of the Fair. The Still Living Room is a lovely place to sit and talk with people who have been involved with the Fair and the counterculture for many decades.

Emily's concept for the 2024 poster is the culmination of the theme of her trio of poster designs from 2022-2024. The reclining fox in the shady tree canopy above the loud and dusty parade on the path represents the dual sides of the Fair, where some come for rest and relaxation and some come for high excitement. There is also a focus on the more urban wildlife that exists on the Fair site, centering species like foxes, coyotes and raccoons that are associated a bit more with revels and mischief.



## Archaeology Park 1881

Step back in time along the banks of the Long Tom River with Ark Park's rich educational, research and preservation experiences. Our buildings of hand-split cedar were built with traditional construction methods. The Park hosts demonstrations on traditional skills, including flint knapping, fire making, cedar log splitting, hide tanning and basketry. Learn about the Kalapuya people, their history and the world they lived in then and today, including how the Kalapuyans managed their landscape and harvested its bounty. Visit with our archaeologist at the Ark Park museum to learn about the U of O archaeological studies during the 1980s that found over 10,500 years of cultural history and saved the Fair. And peruse replicated items and instructional books produced by our demonstrators for sale at the Trade Booth. Join our workshops or just stop by and learn something new about some very old skills.

## Fair Philanthropy

The Fair has been rooted in philanthropy since it began as a fundraiser for a children's program more than a half century ago. Our philanthropy is focused on building community and helping people thrive.

We have three grantmaking programs that together have donated more than \$1.5 million: The Bill Wooten Endowment Fund, the Jill Heiman Vision Fund and Board of Directors donations. To learn more, wander over to Wally's Way to visit the Galleria Philanthropia booth or visit oregoncountryfair.org.

## **Jill Heiman Vision Fund**

Five nonprofit groups with proposals related to the environment and sustainability will receive grants from the donations made to the Jill Heiman Vision Fund at this year's Fair.

• Whole Earth Nature School will pay park rental fees for its Summer Camp program that helps connect youth with nature through skill-building and education.

• Northwest Youth Corps will purchase work boots, gloves and work shirts to offer to youth participants who face financial barriers to participating. Funds will also repair zippers on the sleeping bags that are loaned out each year.

• McKenzie River Trust will remove invasive species from the Oregon oak and prairie habitat at Coyote Spencer Wetlands to promote native plant growth.

• **Cascadia Wildlands** will use the grant to outfit a summer camp kitchen for the wildCATs volunteers, who field-check proposed timber sales on federally

managed lands. The funds will also support volunteers providing educational outreach on the threats to oldgrowth forests on public lands.

• Beyond Toxics will design a community public education campaign about the harmful effects of artificial turf on wildlife and water quality, focusing on playing fields proposed at Golden Gardens park in the Bethel area.

Look for donation boxes at Information Booths around the Fair. Food vouchers, cash or checks may be donated. Checks and cash donations are tax-deductible; please include address for mailed receipt. The Board will triple the power of your gift by matching every \$1 donated with \$2, up to a total of \$20,000.

## **Bill Wooten Endowment Fund**

The Bill Wooten Endowment Fund awarded a total of \$15,000 to support nonprofit organizations serving youth in the Fair's neighboring communities in the Fern Ridge area. The grants tangibly represent the Fair's deep appreciation of our home community.

## **Annual Endowment Funding**

• **Culture Jam:** Fern Ridge area youth will receive scholarships to attend this eight-day arts-based empowerment camp for teenagers held each summer at the Fair site.

• Elmira Elementary School: The "Shake A Leg Dance Project" will allow K-5 students to learn about and practice different dance forms with a professional dancer/teacher.

• Lane Arts Council: The Fern Ridge Public Library will offer three free workshops combining reading and art, focusing on the intersection of science and art. The program will engage students' creativity in learning about ecology and conservation.

• Rural Art Center: The Crow-Applegate-Lorane School District depends on the Center to provide afterschool multi-cultural art instruction on shortened school days.

• SMART – Start Making A Reader Today: Community volunteers will be trained and supported in helping students at Elmira and Veneta Elementary Schools develop a love of reading, with books representing diverse identities.

• Veneta Elementary School: Through the "Bend It, Build It, Be Creative with Wire Sculpture" students will create an animal- or human-inspired sculpture. Children will learn about anatomy, 3D design, and basic color theory, as well as how to use proportions, construct a frame and build a body around the frame.

• Wordcrafters: This collaborative project with Elmira High School will provide a creative writing residency focusing on spoken word writing and performance.

#### Leslie Scott Imagine Grant Award

The annual Leslie Scott Imagine Grant Award is recognition given to the endowment-funded project best representing former Fair General Manager Leslie Scott's contributions, which included: providing opportunities for youth; reaching out to our neighbors; and nurturing creativity of all sorts. This year's awardee is Elmira Elementary School.
