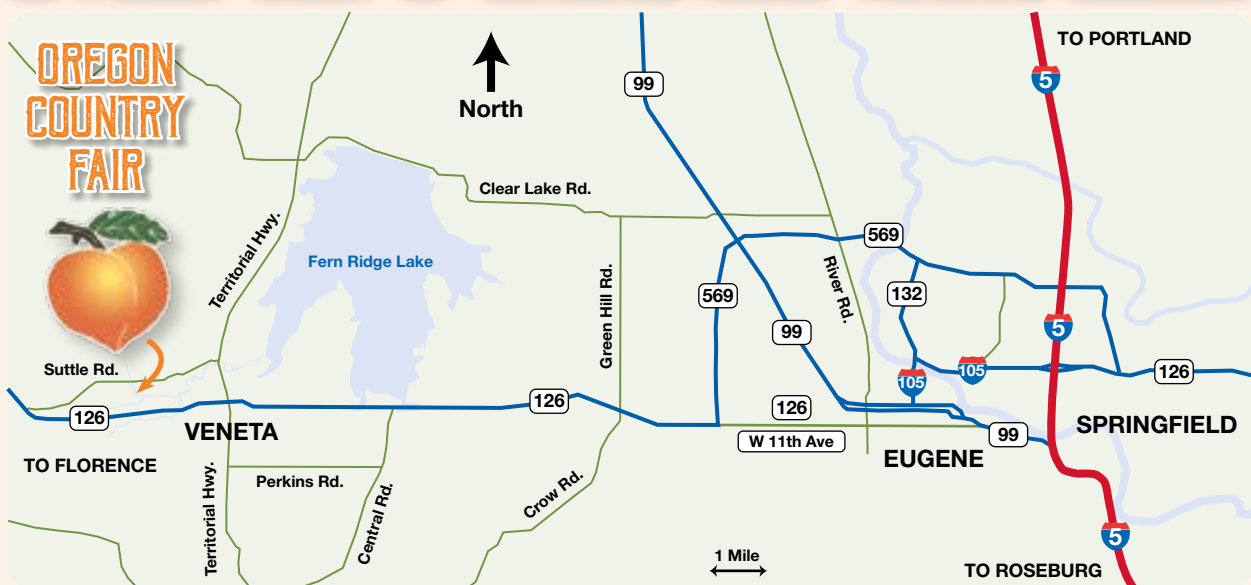

Tickets

Tickets are available at aftontickets.com/ocf2026. NO tickets are available on the Fair site.

- **Early Bird pricing, through June 15th:** \$50 for Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.
- **Full price after June 15th:** \$60 for Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.
- **Children 12 and under are free.**
- **Seniors (65 and over) and alter-abled are \$5 off.**

Shuttle Bus Service [K2]

Ride the bus! You don't need a bus ticket; your Fair pass gets you on any LTD bus for free. That includes fast and frequent shuttle service from Valley River Center and the downtown LTD station. The **LAST BUS LEAVES THE FAIR SITE AT 7:30!**

Camping

Medical & Crisis Response [D5 & L3]

White Bird Rock Medicine (WBRM) is your 24/7 emergency response. We dispatch trained medical and mental health professionals to incidents anywhere on site, embracing a harm reduction approach to compassionate care. Stop by anytime for basic needs, first aid, and emotional support. All services are free and confidential.

WBRM is now a stand-alone nonprofit, with proceeds supporting other local community nonprofits.

Each of our two locations has doctors available 24/7 throughout the event. Call us instead of 911, we are the fastest response!

How to find us:

- **Visit our two locations:** **Big Bird** next to Main Stage Meadow and **Little Wing** in Xavanadu near Wind Gate.
- **Find any Fair staff person carrying a radio.**
- **Call us via the Fair's internal telephone system,** located at most stages, gates, and info booths.

Basic First Aid supplies are also available at all info booths. A.E.D.'s are distributed throughout the event site (see the map).

Recycling

We are dedicated to minimizing the impact we have on our land and planet. Our success depends upon you! All the food service ware, including beverage cups, are compostable or reusable!

- Place disposable service ware and beverage cups in the green compost receptacles.
- Used utensils go into the utensil buckets at each collection kiosk.

Smokin' [B6, B8, C4, F6, K3, K6, L4, L7]

To allow smokers and non-smokers to live in harmony, we ask those who smoke or vape tobacco to smoke only in designated smoking areas. When you see the butt-cans, you will know you have found a smoking area.

Help us spread awareness by respecting each other, not smoking on the paths, not smoking in stage audiences, and helping each other locate the nearest smoking area. There is absolutely no cannabis smoking or vaping allowed at the Fair.

Bag Checks [B4 & L4]

We have two options for storing your items while at the Fair:

- **Dragon Plaza:** Look for the "Check It" sign in the SW corner of the plaza.
- **Main Stage Meadow:** Visit the WOW Hall Bag Check.

Access Advocates for the Alter Abled (4A) [K4 & E5]

We promote equal access for all Fair participants with equipment loans, sign language interpreters, and other assistance including advocacy, education, and advice. 4A is located in the Dragon's Head at the entrance and also in Community Village.

Child Care [B4 & H2 & K5]

The Child Care Crew is dedicated to bringing the magic of Fair to the youngest among us!

- **Sesame Street Child Care:** Checked-in, supervised childcare for potty-trained, willing kids with a range of thoughtful, stimulating, and enriching activities and entertainment. The Child Care Crew also offers expert alter-abled and special needs care. Please ask our friendly desk staff for more information!
- **Wally's Way Family Fun Zone:** Family-friendly entertainment, an enchanted castle playground, free library, and hands-on crafting, learning, and imaginative play with a range of sensory care spaces, gadgets, and gizmos. Whether you're feeling overwhelmed or just need a moment to recharge, this calm environment offers a peaceful atmosphere to help you pause and reset.
- **"Mellow spaces":** Semi-supervised shady areas on Sesame Street, Wally's Way, and Moon Path in Xavanadu where families with small children can relax and recharge. These spaces offer a limited selection of books and sensory activities specifically geared toward babies and toddlers.

Cloth Diaper Service [F4]

Unfortunately, this service is not available this year.

Keeping Green

EXPLORE

Ambiance Wandering Performers bring physical and performance artistry to another level. This year's artists create a delightful array of experiences throughout the Fair. It's a living art treasure hunt—can you find them all!?

DRAGON PLAZA [K3]

Don't miss our special Dragon Plaza performances and activities throughout the day! The day opens with a whimsical welcome from Diva Galactika stilters and Revelers Contemporary Circus along with upbeat, toe-tapping tunes from Critter Jug. Once you pass through the celebrations in the Plaza and into the paths of the Fair, you'll be ready to frolic!

Diva Galactika

These stilters extraordinaire present a spectacle of mythical winged creatures with undeniable daring and comical enchantment!

Revelers Contemporary Circus

High-flying aerial artists dancing in the sky dazzle you with feats of strength, flexibility, and jaw-dropping acrobatics.

Critter Jug

Spontaneous woodland creature musical moments from an old-time/jug-band: washboard and washtub bass magic!



ON THE PATHS

Towering dream creatures. A friendly card game. Talking trees. Whimsical serenades. Wise words. Works of that art come to life. What will you discover on your wander through the Fair?

Stoneborn Goblins

Wild beats, strange sounds, and a frazzled forest druid create a moving woodland parade of moss-covered, lichen-dusted, and wide-eyed stone goblins just emerged from the forest floor.

Animal Cracker Conspiracy

Giant puppets and stilted beings glide overhead, altering the scale of the space and transforming the familiar into the fantastical. A celebration of spontaneity and meaningful connection.

RaZzle DaZzle presents Queen Bee-a-Trice and Her Royal Bee-atches

A glittering swarm of pollen-dusted clown antics, leaving hearts stung and dripping with delight. Flitting through the Fair as the bees do: drifting, circling, landing where the nectar is sweetest. Where the Queen leads, the court follows.

Diosas De Fuego

Birds of Paradise temple dancers accompanied by Hang musicians and percussionists.



Gravity Thieves

The Marquis and Madame de Baguette are impossibly tall, ridiculous French aristocrats who have clearly had too much champagne and not enough gravity.

Mythic Times

Mythical beings brought to life, weaving joy, whimsy, and wonder into the fabric of reality. They'll transport you into a world where magic is real, dreams take form, and the extraordinary thrives in the everyday.

Calliope Circus: Dare to Be Here!

Fantastical beings defy imagination, challenge sensibility, and engage the reluctantly-opening heart.

Coyote Rising Giant Puppets

Larger than life beings frolic and involve crowds in interactive play, dancing amongst the main stage crowds and all along the paths.

Chicken Little

Stilt troupe dedicated to inspiring child-like wonder and whimsy since 1979.

The Radar Angels

Playful peaches sing, dance, and spread joyful peachy vibes.

Opal the Bubble Fairy

Drifting through the Fair and weaving wonder with giant bubbles and gentle magic.

Luna Dance Troupe

Roving belly dancers with live percussion, bringing rhythm, movement, and joyful surprise to the paths.

Frick Frack Blackjack

The barter-based game where you can bet anything in the work—except money.

Jonny Hahn

Rocking political path piano and vocals.

Chip Cohen

A strolling fiddler, wandering the paths and putting magical music into the air.

DAYDREAM



ART AMBIENCE

Wander meandering paths among the delicate wonder of the Fair, where art and nature meet in unexpected harmony. Tucked among the embrace of trees and dappled sunlight, you'll discover sculptures and installations created by talented local and regional artists, each piece offering its own story, texture, and voice. From whimsical figures that spark a child's imagination to thought-provoking works that invite reflection, the forest becomes a living gallery of diverse expression.

No two bends are the same. A curve in the lane might reveal a towering form crafted from reclaimed materials, or a delicate creative treasure that seems to grow right from the earth itself. These moments of spontaneous discovery are part of the Fair's quiet magic—little surprises waiting just beyond your next step.

Take your time, look closely, and let curiosity guide you. Whether you're young or simply young at heart, the woodland art creates an ambience all its own, inviting you to pause, explore, and delight in the creativity woven gently into the Fair's unique landscape.



DODECA ART FARM [E5]

Nestled on seven and a half acres, Dodeca Art Farm—known to many as “the Art Barn”—is one of the Fair's essential partners. What began as an old chicken farm has grown under the care of Andy and Tulsi Strickland into a living hub of creativity, craft, and community service.

The property houses 25 pieces of historic installation art—from the beloved kaleidoscope to the giant Adirondack chair—all stored, restored, and redeployed each Fair by Andy and his collaborators. The Art Barn itself holds one of the largest tool libraries on site—a metal shop, bike shop, maker space, and woodworking tools—available to crews and builders throughout the season. At least eight Fair crews maintain a footprint on the property.

From October through May, the farm runs artist-in-residence programs, hosts contemplative stays for guests from various faith traditions, and maintains practice rooms and art spaces for visiting musicians and artists.

HONOR

THE ELDERS' STILL LIVING ROOM [H5]

The Still Living Room & Magical History Tour Theater

Savor the present and treasure the past in the enchanting Still Living Room, the multi-faceted Fair Elders' booth. The large, colorful space offers an assortment of experiences: relaxing or visiting on comfortable, shaded benches; exploring the Timeline murals commemorating each decade of the Fair's history; writing a message to a deceased loved one on the Peggy Day Fitzgerald Memorial Kiosk; or discovering the unique exhibits in the micro-museum, which is curated in coordination with the Fair Archives.

In the Magical History Tour Theater, videos about the Fair play all day. Check out the newly restored Dragon Bench, a popular place for taking photos of family and friends. Fair Elders are always available to answer questions, swap stories, and add to your enjoyment of the Still Living Room and the Fair.

ARCHAEOLOGY PARK [B8]

Step back in time along the banks of the Long Tom River with Ark Park's education, research, and preservation of the Fair's rich archaeological heritage. Our buildings of hand-split cedar were built with traditional construction methods. Ark Park hosts demonstrations of humanity's ancient skills including flint knapping, fire making, hide tanning, and basketry. Learn about the Kalapuya people, their history, and the world they lived in then and today, including how the Kalapuya managed their landscape and harvested its bounty. Visit with our archaeologist at the Ark Park museum to learn about the UO archaeological studies during the 1980s that found over 10,500 years of cultural history and saved the Fair. Peruse replicated items and instructional books produced by our demonstrators for sale at the Trade Booth. Join our workshops, or just stop by and learn something new about some very old skills.

Then take in over 50 years of Fair posters dreamt up by a kaleidoscope of artists—our magical Great Wall of Fairies now fully filled and glowing, just right for a twilight selfie with your first-ever Fair. Take a little piece of the magic with you and snag a poster of your own at merch.oregoncountryfair.org.
- **Over on the Left Bank**, step into a gallery of memories with our beloved photo display. Legendary lens wizard Jay Blakesberg's sparkling snapshots continue to shine, while Kitty Green's portraits of Fair folk still wink from the trees.

RAINBOW VILLAGE [E5]

Located in Community Village, Rainbow Village holds space for queer and trans Fairgoers, prioritizing radical joy. Our space is a collaboration with this community. We care for each other with tenderness, uncompromising advocacy, and pursuit of collective liberation. We offer a place to connect, commiserate, celebrate, explore, honor, seek support, express, or simply rest from the stimulation and bustle. Our space is a point of serendipitous connection. Come gather resources, do a craft, ask questions, or see what other surprises we have in store! Find new treasure at our ongoing clothing swap! Check the Community Village schedule for more.

Rainbow Village recognizes that Black and Indigenous queer and transgender people face disproportionate rates of violence and harm. We are deeply committed to antiracism, showing up in solidarity, and uplifting the work, voices, leadership, and joy of BIPOC.

Mardi Gras Indian Cultural Exchange [13]

This year, we have the pleasure of hosting The Rumble featuring Big Chief Joseph Boudreaux Jr., bringing the unique Mardi Gras Indian cultural tradition from New Orleans. African-American communities began masking as Native Americans in the 1800s to honor Indigenous tribes that helped enslaved people escape and survive. Members form "tribes" led by chiefs, queens, and spy boys, and create elaborate handmade suits decorated with beads, feathers, and sequins. It's an honor and a pleasure to have this cultural exchange at the Fair. Witness The Rumble's visual and musical splendor for yourself, Friday at 5:55 (Main Stage), Saturday at 5:30 (Hoarse Chorale), or Sunday at 6:00 (Monkey Palace).

THE OASIS [M5]

Home of Your BIPOC Sanctuary

In a dedicated effort to welcome the Global Majority community, an AFFINITY space held inside The Oasis was created for the B.I.P.O.C. community.

This is a place where every individual is genuinely celebrated by providing a nurturing sense of community from the proverbial storm. This is a private sanctuary and your safe space, where we provide peer support, relaxation, and mental wellness, centered in JOY!

We acknowledge that the spaces and resources we seek are not just a matter of convenience or preference, but a response to the systemic injustices that have been inflicted upon our communities. We acknowledge that the power and strength of life comes from standing together and supporting one another. We acknowledge that choosing to enjoy any aspect of that life is a radical act. We reject the idea that violence, injustice, discrimination, prejudice, and dominance over others are normal and acceptable acts.

The Fair has been rooted in philanthropy since it began as a fundraiser for a children's school. Our philanthropy is focused on building community and helping people thrive.

We have three grantmaking programs that together have donated nearly \$2 million: The Bill Wooten Endowment Fund, the Jill Heiman Vision Fund, and the Board of Directors' Giving Grants. Jill Heiman Vision Fund

Donations made to the Jill Heiman Fund at this year's Fair will go to five nonprofit groups helping to meet people's basic needs:

- **The Kareng Fund/Caring Fund** provides a safety net for local artisans who experience problems such as medical situations, vehicle failures, fires, or thefts that compromise their ability to work.
- **Mid Lane Cares'** shower and laundry program at the Fern Ridge Service Center benefits unhoused individuals, as well as families and children from the Fern Ridge School District with unstable housing. Donations will go toward a new water heater and hygiene supplies.
- **Oregon Community Asylum Network** helps ICE victims meet basic survival needs. Donations will go toward shelter, utilities, transportation, legal representation, and medical care for asylum seekers.
- **Volunteers in Medicine** provides free health care to low-income adults in Lane County.
- **Willamette Food & Farm Coalition** runs programs in Veneta and Oakridge that direct surplus harvests from local farms to nearby food pantries. Funds will also help finance Protein Bucks (\$10 tokens for purchase of locally raised protein) and Little Sprouts (\$5 tokens to children 12 and under for fresh fruits, vegetables, or plant starts).

Look for donation boxes at Information Booths around the Fair. Food vouchers, cash, or checks may be donated. Checks and cash donations are tax-deductible; please include your address for a mailed receipt. The Board will triple the power of your gift by matching every \$1 donated with \$2, up to a total of \$25,000.

On the 30th anniversary of Jill Heiman Vision Fund, we thank all of our generous donors for giving more than \$696,000 to community nonprofits over the years.

Leslie Scott Imagine Grant Award

This annual award is given to the funded project that best represents former General Manager Leslie Scott's contributions to the Fair, which include providing opportunities for youth, reaching out to our neighbors, and nurturing creativity. This year's awardee is **Elmira Elementary School**.



Bill Wooten Endowment Fund

The Bill Wooten Endowment Fund awarded a total of \$20,000 to support nonprofits serving youth in the Fair's neighboring Fern Ridge communities. The grants tangibly represent the Fair's deep appreciation of our home community.

- **Culture Jam:** Fern Ridge youth will receive scholarships to attend the annual arts-based empowerment camp for teenagers at the Fair site. Culture Jam helps each young person discover their talents in a supportive environment, connect with diverse perspectives, and experience the natural world.
- **Elmira Elementary School:** *FUNDamentals of Acting* will involve all students in a confidence-building, playful exploration of the core elements of theater, and will include purchase of a portable stage that will support a wide range of school and community events. Students will showcase their work at an "Informance" for families and the community.
- **Lane Arts Council:** *Frogscapes with Henri Matisse* will integrate art and science in helping all Veneta Elementary students explore bold color, shape, and composition through the cut paper style of Henri Matisse. Each student will create a layered rainforest collage that can be displayed individually or assembled into a collaborative "class rainforest."
- **SMART – Start Making A Reader Today:** Community volunteers will be trained and supported in helping students at Elmira and Veneta Elementary Schools develop a love of reading, and titles will feature diverse identities. Teachers report increased reading engagement and confidence, which are closely linked to overall literacy achievement.
- **Wordcrafters:** This collaborative project with Elmira High School will engage all ninth- and twelfth-graders in creative writing residencies focusing on spoken word. Educators welcome Wordcrafters' residencies for their proven ability to engage students and enlarge their writing experience and skills, which helps build school success.

Rooted in a childhood of wild imaginings on a small farm at the end of Hoot 'N Holler Lane in Dixonville, Oregon, Jill Carter's artistic journey began among a delightfully chaotic cast of characters—farm animals, woodland creatures, and a few personalities only she could see. Her earliest drawings layered fantasy onto photographs, revealing the secret lives of furry friends with stories to tell and mischief to make.

That instinct for storytelling grew into a multidisciplinary practice shaped by years in theatrical scenic and lighting design, where diverse worlds were conjured on stage. Today, her illustrations carry that same sense of stagecraft—rich with atmosphere, personality, and a touch of magic—whether brought to life in pencil, paint, pixels, photographic collage, or a joyful blend of them all.

A longtime fixture of the Oregon Country Fair, Jill began working at Blazing Salads in the mid-'80s and has eagerly returned every year since. After decades of running a beloved food booth, she is delighted and honored to have been selected as this year's poster artist—a lifelong dream come true.

When not playing in the magic of the Fair, Jill is a freelance graphic designer and illustrator based in Olympia, Washington. Jill's work celebrates collaboration, imagination, and the quiet wonder hidden in plain sight—inviting viewers to pause, smile, and glimpse new whimsical worlds.
